**Background:**

On October 15, 1987, the property located at 11401 W. Mequon Rd., also known as the Ludwig Hilgendorf House, was given Landmark status in the City of Mequon (Intensive Survey attached). There are three landmark structures on the property, the original home and summer kitchen were constructed in 1842 and a second home was built in 1888. Lee O. Her purchased this property on September 24, 2019. Mr. Her is requesting to have the landmark distinction removed from the property due to the substantial investment required to restore the original home.

**Local Landmark**

Section 58-724 of the Mequon Code of Ordinances states, “It is declared a matter of public policy that the protection, enhancement, perpetuation and use of improvements of special character or special historical interest or value is a public benefit and is desired in the interests of the health, prosperity, safety and welfare of the people.” As described in the intensive survey, the Ludwig Hilgendorf House is a unique property displaying outstanding examples of two German buildings that were common to the German settlers in Mequon. These houses, because of their size and the craftsmanship of construction, are some of the finest examples that exist outside museum settings. A very detailed description of the property is included in the attached intensive survey.

**Analysis:** Mr. Her has provided staff with pictures (attached) of the current status of the original home and has described the following issues:

- Substantial roof damage
- Substantial floor damage
- Cracks in the foundation, parts sinking
- Porch is sinking

- Trees overgrown, touching power lines
- Holes in exterior of building, stones missing
- Stone siding is missing sections, cracked and falling

Based on the information provided, there is significant structural damage to the floor system due to the failing roof allowing water to rot the beams. The pictures also reveal the property has not been kept up based on the amount of garbage located on the floor. Sec. 58-729 of the Mequon Code of Ordinances states “The owners of any landmark, landmark site or improvement on a landmark site or in a historic district shall maintain such property or cause or permit it to be maintained in a condition consistent with the provisions of this article.” It is staff’s understanding that most of the damage was due to neglect of the former owner.

### **Summary**

Mr. Her has not provided any estimates to staff to bring the original Ludwig Hilgendorf House back to its pre-existing condition. A recent staff site visit revealed the original house has in fact been severely damaged due to the lack of a proper roofing system. Mr. Her described to staff that when he purchased the property, the trees surrounding the house had not been properly maintained and this subsequently caused large holes in the roof from the branches that were overhanging. Mr. Her did remove the trees that caused the damage, but it was too late. Mr. Her did express his desire to restore the original house; however, due to the significant damage, it would need to be completely rebuilt, thus making it no longer original. Mr. Her also stated he may try to salvage the summer kitchen and restore the second home built in 1888.

### **Recommendation:**

The neglect of the property is not a valid excuse to raze buildings of historical significance; however, in this case, the irreparable damage to the original home was caused prior to Mr. Her purchasing the property. Staff recommends rescission of the Landmark status for the original 1842 home at 11401 W. Mequon Road while maintaining the Landmark status for the 1888 home and the summer kitchen.

DESCRIPTION:

The main house on this property is a two-story gabled ell house that has steeply-pitched gables, clapboard siding and a fieldstone foundation. Windows are mostly tall and narrow and topped with cornice lintels. An ell porch with curved brackets and plain square posts is on the front facade.

The second house on this property is a combination frame, limestone, and half-timber house. The half timber house is a rectangular building with a German timber frame that is filled in with wattle and daub nogging made of the cream colored clay found in eastern Wisconsin. There are some crude windows that are filled in with six-over-six light double-hung sashes. There is a low-pitched gable roof and the gables are covered with clapboards. The house sits on a stone foundation.

Attached to the half-timber house is a one and one-half story ell constructed of limestone rubble. It has a low-pitched gable roof covered with wood shingles. The window openings have segmental stone arches and six-over-six light double-hung sashes. A porch spans one side of the ell. It is made up of rough-hewn round posts and a balustrade of fence boards.

Attached to the stone ell is a one and one-half story frame ell. It has a steeply-pitched gable roof covered with wood shingles, clapboard siding, and an ell porch with a shed roof and plain square posts. Windows are two-over-two light double-hung sashes decorated with cornice lintels.

Also on the property is a fieldstone summer kitchen. It is a one-story small, square building with a low-pitched gable roof and crude openings frame with wood. A small projection from the end wall is probably a bake oven. A chimney made of cream bricks rises from one end of the building.

A gable-roofed basement barn is also on the property. It has board siding, large sliding doors and a fieldstone foundation. An early twentieth century concrete silo sits at one end of the barn. Completing the farm complex is a machine shed/animal stable. It has board siding, large sliding doors and at one end are walls constructed of fieldstone.

ARCHITECTURAL/ENGINEERING SIGNIFICANCE

The entire Ludwig Hilgendorf farmstead is eligible for the National Register of Historic Places as an intact nineteenth and early twentieth century farm. It has outstanding examples of two German buildings that were common to the German settlers in Mequon and southeastern Wisconsin. They are the half-timber house and fieldstone-constructed summer kitchen and/or smokehouse. The half-timber portion of the older home on the property is in excellent condition and illustrates well the German half-timber house. These half-timber houses were once common in the Milwaukee area, but many have been demolished and there are probably a number of examples hidden under siding. This house, because of its size and the craftsmanship of its construction, is one of the finest examples that exist outside museum settings.

The fieldstone summer kitchen is also a fine example of both its type of construction and its type of building. The extension off the rear of the building is not seen in other smokehouses or summer kitchens in Mequon, of which there are many.

The stone and frame additions to the half-timber house are also significant, one for its limestone construction, and the other for its expression of typical building techniques found on frame houses of this vintage in the area. The large frame house is a fine example of the gabled ell vernacular form. Many vernacular houses exist in Mequon and many are gabled ells. But few have the level of preservation and integrity that this building has. Overall, this entire farmstead is a fine and intact example of a nineteenth and early twentieth century German farmstead and every effort should be made to preserve it as intact as possible.

### HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

Karl Ludwig and Wilhelm

This farmstead was owned by Ludwig Hilgendorf between 1842 and 1892 and by J. J. Hilgendorf between 1915 and 1924. As of 1989, a descendent of Ludwig Hilgendorf still owned the property. Wilhelm Ludwig Hilgendorf was born on April 16, 1832 in Treptow, northern Germany. He came with his father, Karl Ludwig Hilgendorf, to Mequon as part of the Freistadt settlement. The Freistadt settlement was a group of immigrants from northern Germany who were at odds with the German rulers in regard to the practice of their Lutheran religion. The earliest Freistadt immigrants came in 1839, some settling near Buffalo, New York and the rest coming to the town of Mequon. Karl Ludwig Hilgendorf probably built the original half-timber section of the older home on this property. Later, his son, Wilhelm Ludwig, probably added the additions. The date of construction of the newest house on the property suggests that it may have been built for the next generation of Hilgendorfs, the J. J. Hilgendorf family. [a,b

J. J. Hilgendorf was probably responsible for the construction of the barn and the machine shed/animal stable.

### HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE

This farmstead is eligible for the National Register of Historic Places under criterion A, history, because it was the home to a prominent original Freistadt immigrant, a significant group of German immigrants who put their ethnic stamp on the western portion of the town (later, city) of Mequon. The Freistadt settlers came to Wisconsin for religious freedom. They came in a group and throughout the nineteenth and even twentieth century, maintained close ties with each other. They formed their own church and school and intermarried frequently. The Freistadt settlers were an important a significant ethnic group in Mequon and in southeastern Wisconsin and the Hilgendorf family was one of the most prosperous and prominent families among the Freistadt community. Because of their association with the Freistadt settlement and because this farmstead has fine examples of ethnic German construction and building types, the Hilgendorf farmstead is significant in southeastern Wisconsin.

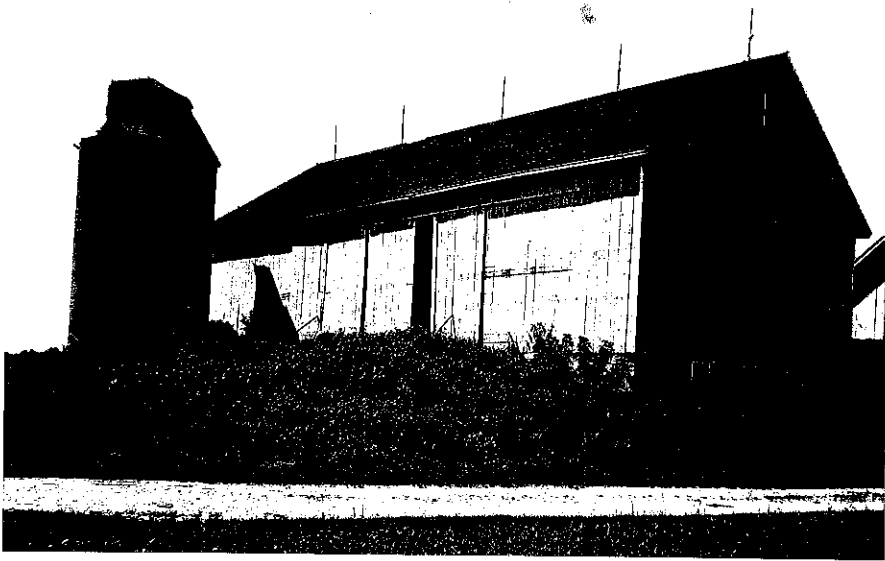

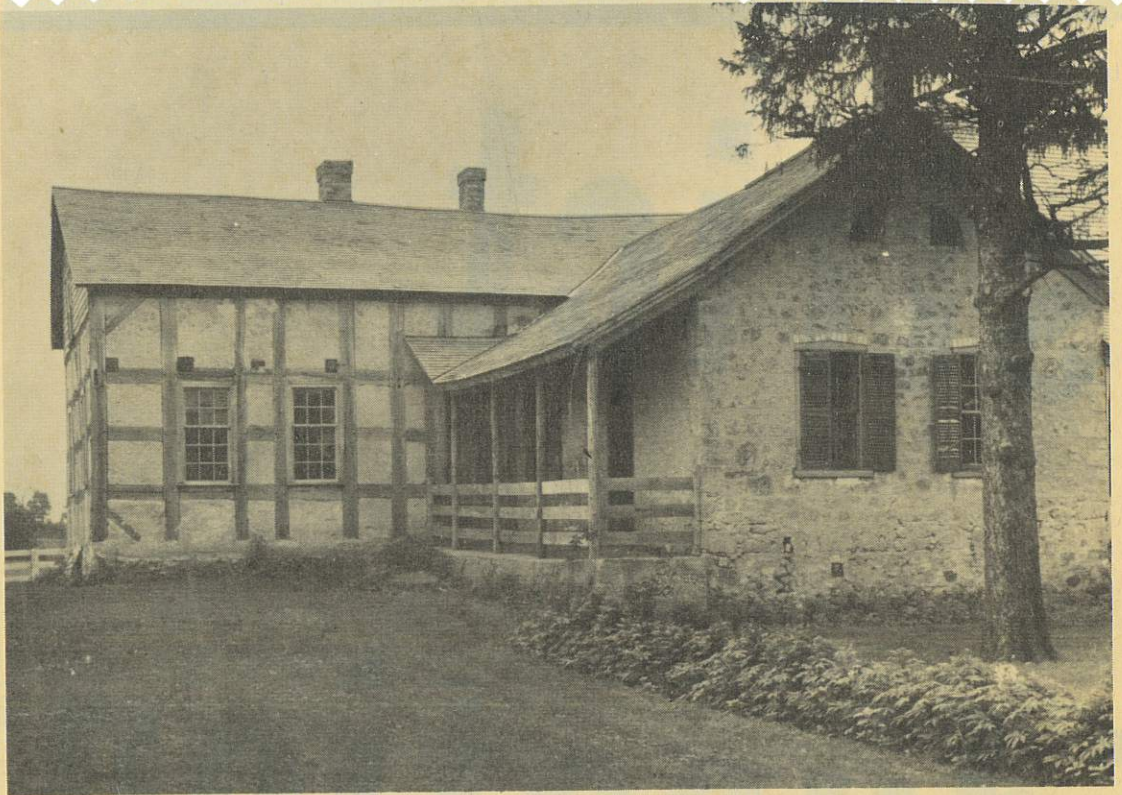

**HALF TIMBER HOUSE.** Hundreds and hundreds of hours of labor for one Ozaukee County man are finally drawing to an end as Oscar Hilgendorf, a dairy farmer in Mequon, has almost finished restoring what is probably Wisconsin's oldest half timber house. The house was built in 1842 by his great grandfather, and the stone and masonry section was added about four years later. The house has been handed down from generation to generation starting with Ernst Frederich Hilgendorf who settled there in 1839; it was then left to Lud-

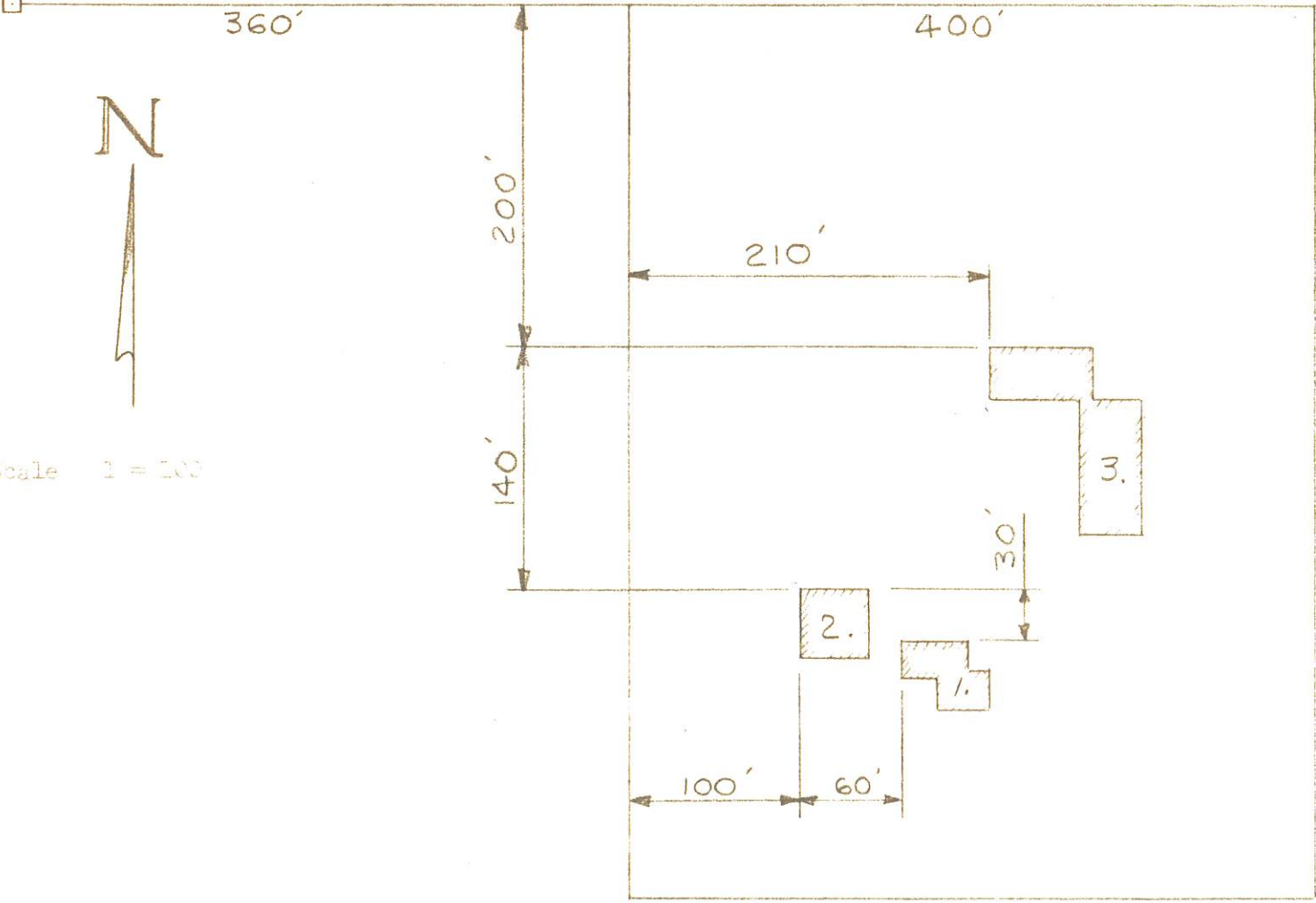
wig, who in turn left it to John J., who in turn left it to Oscar. The house which is located on Mequon Road (Hy. 167) 3½ miles west of Hy. 57 just —over the Granville road will be opened this Sunday, Aug. 6, for the public to view. The grand opening is scheduled for 1:00 to 5:00 p.m. and will be open on Sunday afternoons for the same hours during the rest of the summer months.
