SUBJECT: RESOLUTION 3880 A Resolution Adopting an Updated Mid-Moraine Municipal Court Bond Schedule for City Ordinance Citations

Background

Pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 800.037, a jurisdiction's municipal court judge, with the approval of the Common Council, shall establish a deposit schedule (a/k/a bond schedule) for municipal citations. The bond schedule ultimately reflects the face-value for any citation issued for municipal ordinance violations. The Mid Moraine Municipal Court uses a consistent bond schedule with all its participating municipalities. This allows imposed bond amounts to be consistent from community to community. The municipal judge has reviewed the existing bond schedule and determined that an increase in the base amounts for violations is appropriate.

The last increase to the base amount was in 2009. Under an amendment to the statutes in 2013, the Court Costs portion of the bond schedule, which is added to the base amount to comprise the total deposit amount was increased by \$5. The increase in court costs reflected a change to the penalty assessment surcharge, which is 26% (this amount goes to the State of Wisconsin).

Analysis

The proposed increases for the Base Fine amounts are generally \$25.00 (resulting in a total increase of \$31.50 with court costs added) for a first offense, \$35.00 (\$44.10) for second offense, and \$45.00 (\$56.70) for third and subsequent violations. Accordingly, the total bond amount on a typical City ordinance citation will go from \$218.50 to \$250.00.

The Total Bond amount of a typical citation is broken down as follows:

Current	Proposed

More serious violations such as Possession of Marijuana or Battery have a current first offense Total Bond amount of \$439.00. The proposed increase would calculate to a Total Bond amount of \$470.50 for these more serious violations.

The proposed general bond schedule recommended by Mid-Moraine is attached. This schedule shows the current and the new recommended bond schedules. Also attached is an updated copy of the Mequon Bond schedule with the proposed changes already applied. A letter from the court regarding the proposed changes signed by Judge Christine E. Ohlis and Municipal Court Clerk Kathleen Buth is also attached.

Fiscal Impact

The base fine amounts are paid to the City of Mequon, therefore there will be an increase in fees collected.

Recommendation

A recommendation is forthcoming from the Public Safety Committee on September 14, 2021.

A Resolution Adopting an Updated Mid-Moraine Municipal Court Bond Schedule for City
Ordinance Citations

RECITALS

A. The City of Mequon is a participating member of the Mid-Moraine Municipal Court.

B. Pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 800.037, the municipal court judge, with the approval of the Common Council, shall establish a deposit schedule (a/k/a bond schedule) for municipal citations.

C. The City of Mequon and the Mid-Moraine Municipal Court have not increased the fine amounts since 2009.

D. The City has previously adopted a recommended bond schedule for Municipal Court actions and the Mid-Moraine Municipal Court judge has recommended that all of the member jurisdictions adopt a revised bond schedule.

E. In the majority of instances, the recommended fine amounts will increase by \$25.00 for a first offense, \$35.00 for a second offense and \$45.00 for third and subsequent offenses.

BASED UPON THE FOREGOING RECITALS, IT IS RESOLVED by the Common Council of the City of Mequon, Wisconsin that the bond schedule recommended by the Mid-Moraine Municipal Court Judge, as shown in the attached Exhibit A, is adopted with an effective date of October 1, 2021.

SUBJECT: Intersection Improvement Updates and Accident Information for the intersection of W. Freistadt Road (CTH F) and N. Wasaukee Road (CTH M).

Background:

A resident contacted Alderman Mayr with concerns regarding the safety of traffic flow and the number of accidents at this intersection. The citizen was looking for any opportunities to improve the safety in this location. This intersection is not under the jurisdiction of the City of Mequon. This intersection is controlled by Washington County.

Analysis:

The intersection is currently a two-way stop, with stop signs for vehicles traveling on Wasaukee Road. Traffic on Freistadt Road does not need to stop. The speed limit on Wasaukee Road is 40 mph and is 45mph on Freistadt Road.

Washington County is planning the roadway reconstruction of a 1.5-mile section of CTH M (Wasaukee Rd), from the intersection of Freistadt Rd (CTH F) northerly 1.5 miles. The project will improve the poor condition of the existing roadway pavement with upgrades to the vertical curves, roadway cross section (paved shoulders), and improvements to the Highland Road and Freistadt Road (CTH F) intersections, all of which will improve safety for the travelling public. The project is currently scheduled for construction starting in spring of 2022.

Director Lundeen is in contact with Washington County and has received information that a four-way stop is included in the intersection improvement plan. She indicated a technical memo had been previously done by Washington County supporting a four way stop at this intersection.

Recommendation:

Mequon City Engineering to continue to work with Washington County to make necessary improvements to this intersection including installing a four way stop.
