Background

At the March 11 COTW meeting, the Common Council were provided the opportunity to provide feedback on the 2025 Community Survey Instrument that the Public Welfare Committee has been crafting since August 2024.

Discussion

It is anticipated the Public Welfare Committee will dedicate time at its Special Meeting on March 20 to discuss the feedback that was received from the Common Council and how it can be best incorporated into the existing survey instrument. To assist the Committee with its review, attached to this memo is an updated survey with track changes incorporate the feedback from the Council and some various options, for the pool question in particular, for consideration.

Furthermore, staff has prepared an anticipated timeline for the remaining steps of the Survey process and drafts of the necessary public communication items for the Committee's feedback. The following communication items are appended:

- Timeline
- Postcard for residents getting the QR Code
- Paper Survey Mailing Envelope
- Yard Signs
- Outreach (Press Release, Facebook, Website, Weekly Bulletin)

It should be noted that, based on feedback from officials, staff has coordinated with ETC to ensure postcards will be printed on colored stock and will feature the City's logo for branding. Mailing envelopes for respondents receiving a paper copy of the survey will be a similar color and will also include the City's logo and return address.

Following the Committee's meeting on March 20, the staff and ETC will conduct a final review of the survey and accompanying documents for any grammatical or formatting errors before public outreach begins.

Recommendation

Finalize the above items and submit the final survey draft to ETC Institute by the first week of April so the consultant can prepare for distribution.

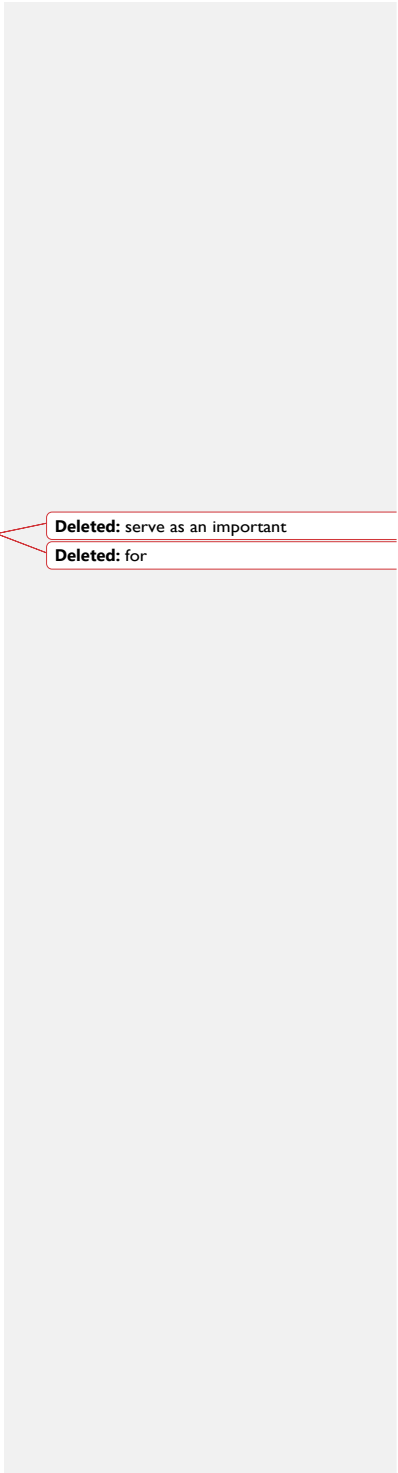

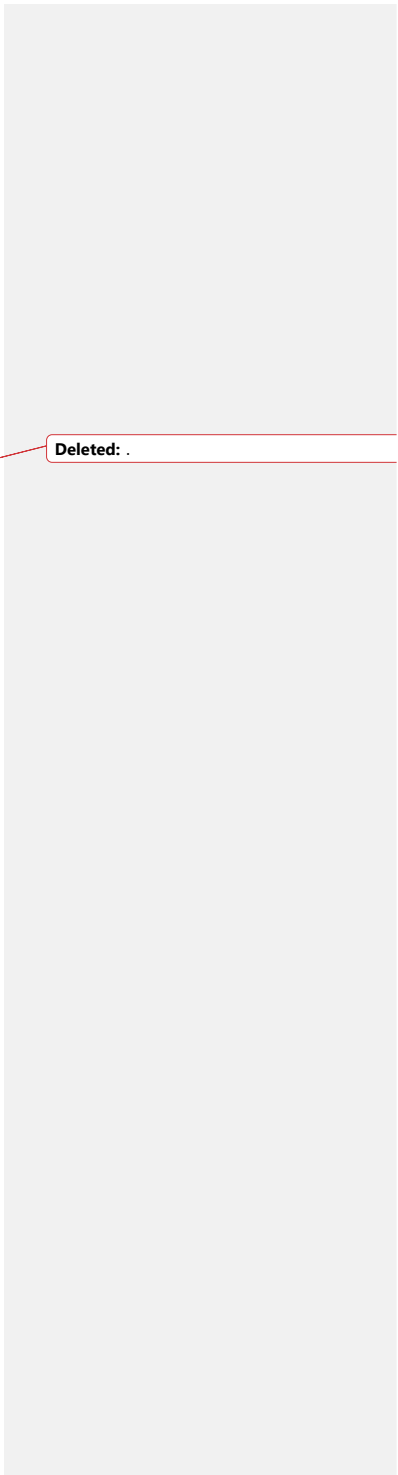
INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT

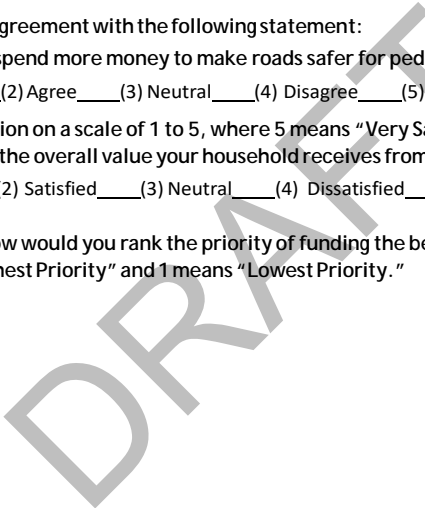

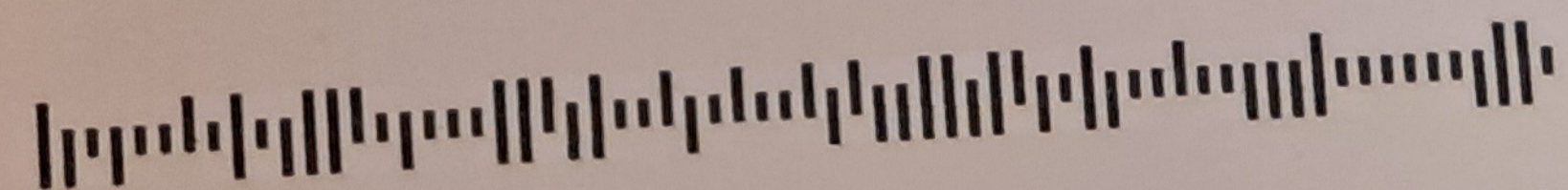
