Chief Pryor

- On January 1, 2023, dispatch was consolidated with Ozaukee County. It is going well, there are still some bugs to be worked out. Sergeant Heinen is working as the liaison between the department and Ozaukee Dispatch.
- Officer Perez has left the department to pursue new career opportunities outside law enforcement.
- Officer Umhoefer retired after 29 years of service.
- There is currently one person eligible to retire and one officer in the hiring process for the US Marshalls, creating two potential openings.
- Available mental health resources for staff were discussed.
